GOSPEL LESSON Luke 3:7-18 Read by: Cecilia Achila

⁷ John said to the crowds coming out to be baptised by him, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath?

⁸ Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not begin to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our father."

For I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. ⁹ The axe has been laid to the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.'

- 10 'What should we do then?' the crowd asked.
- ¹¹ John answered, 'Anyone who has two shirts should share with the one who has none, and anyone who has food should do the same.'
- ¹² Even tax collectors came to be baptised. 'Teacher,' they asked, 'what should we do?'
- ¹³ 'Don't collect any more than you are required to,' he told them.
- ¹⁴ Then some soldiers asked him, 'And what should we do?'

He replied, 'Don't extort money and don't accuse people falsely – be content with your pay.'

¹⁵ The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might possibly be the Messiah. ¹⁶ John answered them all, 'I baptise you with water.
